for I have laid out my case before you.



² Preach the word. Be ready whether it is convenient or not. Correct, rebuke, and encourage, with all patience and teaching. ³ For there will come a time when people will not put up with sound doctrine. 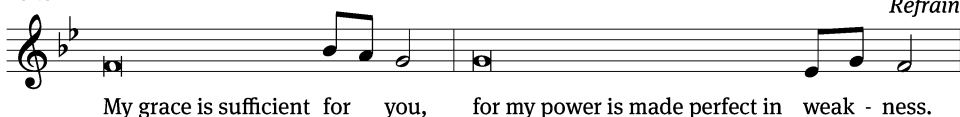

Grant us these things, Father, for the sake of Jesus, who died and rose again.

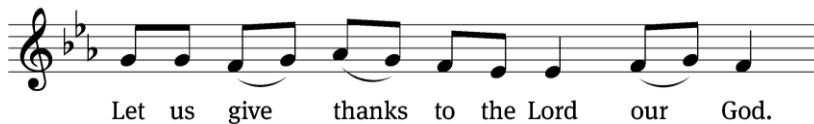
