




# First Reading Ezekiel 2:1–7

<sup>1</sup>He said to me, "Son of man, stand up on your feet, and I will speak with you." <sup>2</sup>The Spirit entered into me as he spoke to me and brought me up to my feet. Then I heard him speaking to me.

<sup>3</sup>He said to me, "Son of man, I am sending you to the people of Israel, to disloyal nations, who have been disloyal to me. They and their fathers have rebelled against me to this very day. <sup>4</sup>These children of mine are brazen-faced and hard-hearted. I am sending you to them, and you are to tell them that this is what the LORD God says. <sup>5</sup>Then, whether they listen or do not listen—for they are a rebellious house—then they will know that a prophet has been among them. <sup>6</sup>But you, son of man, do not be afraid of them, and do not be afraid of their words. 2 Timothy 2:1-13

<sup>1</sup>You then, my son, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus. <sup>2</sup>Entrust the things you heard from me, in the presence of many witnesses, to faithful men who will also be able to teach others.

<sup>3</sup>Share hardships as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. <sup>4</sup>No one serving as a soldier gets entangled in the affairs of everyday life. If he does, he will not please the one who enlisted him. <sup>5</sup>Also, if someone competes as an athlete, he does not receive a crown unless he competes according to the rules. <sup>6</sup>The hardworking farmer should receive a share of the crops first. <sup>7</sup>Think about what I am saying, because the Lord will give you understanding in everything.

<sup>8</sup>Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, a descendant of David, in accordance with my gospel, <sup>9</sup>for which I am suffering, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained. <sup>10</sup>For this reason I endure all things for the sake of the elect, so that they also may obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, along with eternal glory. <sup>11</sup>This saying is trustworthy:

Indeed, if we have died with him, we will also live with him;

<sup>12</sup>If we endure, we will also reign with him;

If we deny him, he will also deny us;

<sup>13</sup>If we are faithless, he remains faithful, because he cannot deny himself.





Prayers of intercession may follow.


